1. 2018 FISA Ordinary Congress Outcomes

- a) Elections for the following positions on the Council were held and the following individuals were elected for four-year terms:
 - i. Chair of the Competitive Rowing Commission
Rosie Mayglothling (GBR) re-elected
 - ii. Chair of the Events Commission
Eva Szanto (HUN) elected
 - iii. Chair of the Event Promotion Commission
Pat Lambert (BEL) re-elected
 - iv. Chair of the Masters Rowing Commission
Ron Chen (USA) elected
 - v. Chair of the Para Rowing Commission
Fay Ho (HKG) re-elected
 - vi. Chair of the Umpiring Commission
Patrick Rombaut (BEL) re-elected

Gerritjan Eggenkamp (NED) was elected to complete the term of Mike Williams as FISA Treasurer as Mike decided to end his mandate at the end of 2018 and step down after 25 years in this position.

Rosie Mayglothling (GBR) was elected to complete the Executive Committee term of Mike Tanner who has reached the FISA age limit and has to give up his seat at the end of 2018.

The current Continental Representative for the Americas Jose Quinones (PER) has not sought a new mandate so a process will be launched in the Americas seeking suggestions for the appropriate person to fill this role as described in Appendix 5 on page 127 of the FISA Rule Book.

As well, the current Continental Representative for Africa Khaled Zain El Din (EGY) will participate in a process to identify his successor so a process will be launched in Africa seeking suggestions as mentioned above.

The Linz-Ottensheim organising committee led by Horst Anselm provided teams not only with a well-organised World Rowing Cup II, but also with a valuable opportunity to familiarise themselves with the 2019 World Rowing Championships venue. World Rowing Cup III was a success as well in Lucerne thanks to OC President Andreas Bucher and the Lucerne OC team.

The organising committee of the World Rowing Under 23 Championships in Poznan led by OC President Aleksander Daniel provided excellent conditions for teams, as did the organising team of Dusan Machecek and Pavel Sebesta the World Rowing Junior Championships in Racice. .

- Masters Rowing
- Para Rowing
- Umpiring

NFs are asked to propose candidates who could positively contribute to these technical commissions. The NF should send a letter of nomination from the NF and a completed Commission Member Nomination Form for each candidate, currently on the commission and new nominations, which must be received by 17 August 2018. NFs nominating candidates are expected to commit themselves to provide financial support for the travel and work of the Commission member.

We would like to be clear that existing commission members are not automatically re-appointed and that, if they would like to be considered, their NF must propose them for a new term. Commission Member Nomination Forms are found at this link: <http://www.worldrowing.com/fisa/about-fisa/congress>

In accordance with Bye-Law to Article 55, appointments of Commission members are made by the Council on the recommendation of the newly elected Commission Chair.

3. Key Decisions from the March Executive Committee Meeting

- a. **2022 World Rowing Championships will take place in Racice, Czech Republic.** The Czech Rowing Federation has been able to obtain an important commitment from their government to support the staging of this event and has fully complied with all technical and financial requirements for the event. In accordance with Rule 6, the FISA Council has attributed the hosting of the event so that planning and infrastructure improvements can proceed immediately. b. Commitment to all disciplines of World Rowing

Indoor Rowing - As previously reported, FISA supports the World Rowing Indoor Championships as a fully recognised official event in the World Rowing Calendar. The first such fully recognised event was successfully staged from 13 to 14 February 2018 in Alexandria, Virginia USA. Read more at this link:

Soon FISA will announce the sites for the 2019 and 2020 events that will be directly attributed by the FISA Council. The goal is to open bidding for the right to stage the event from 2021 onwards and this event has now been included in the Strategic Event Attribution process discussed in point 12 below. More information will follow.

Coastal Rowing – As previously announced, the 2018 World Rowing Coastal Championships will take place in Victoria, British Columbia, Canada from 11 to 14 October 2018. FISA is upgrading its support of Coastal Rowing to recognise its value as an additional rowing discipline that offers a unique attraction for rowers and clubs located near the sea.

Drones for TV – The television production of the 2017 World Rowing Championships demonstrated the great addition of images shot from a camera placed on a flying drone. FISA has recognised that this camera adds new and exciting views of our sport and has decided to provide drones for the host television production of all televised World Rowing events this season where allowed by the local authorities.

Harassment and Abuse policy – FISA, with the leadership of the Athlete's and Sports Medicine Commissions, is preparing a FISA-wide policy document to deal with issues of harassment and abuse, including the safeguarding of athletes, at a FISA-level as well as providing a model for NFs at a national-level. It will be released in the coming months.

4. 2018 World Rowing Event Programmes

FISA recently published the 2018 World Rowing Provisional Event Programmes and, following further consultation with NFs, broadcasters and the respective organising committees, a number of these Programmes have been updated. The heats, repechage and semi-final schedules are all, of course, subject to entries whereas the times of the finals are confirmed for the following events:

1. World Rowing Cup I, Belgrade, Serbia
2. World Rowing Cup II, Linz-Ottensheim, Austria
3. World Rowing Cup III, Lucerne, Switzerland
4. World Rowing Under 23 Championships, Poznan, Poland
5. World Rowing Junior Championships, Racice, Czech Republic
6. World Rowing Championships, Plovdiv, Bulgaria
7. Youth Olympic Games regatta, Buenos Aires, Argentina
8. World Rowing Coastal Championships, Victoria, Canada

It should be noted that the programmes of World Rowing Cup I and II do not currently allow for doubling up between non-Paralympic boat classes and Paralympic boat classes, however should teams wish to enter crews in two events, we will consider this after the entry deadline and make adjustments to accommodate this doubling up as far as possible.

Finally, as discussed at the Para Rowing Conference in London in December 2017, all of the non-Paralympic boat classes will be offered at the first and second World Rowing Cup regattas. As these are new events and it is not yet clear how many entries we will have for these events, NFs are requested to indicate to FISA by 30 April their intention to participate in these events. This will allow us to plan alternative scenarios in the case of very low entries e.g. to combine race classes, and also to inform other participating NFs should there be no other entries in an event.

5. Athlete Lane Selection System test at First World Rowing Cup regatta

Based on an initiative from the Athlete's Commission, the FISA Executive Committee has agreed to a limited test of an "Athlete Lane Selection System" at the first World Rowing Cup regatta in Belgrade, SRB from 1 to 3 June 2018. This system aims to test an alternative solution to the allocation and reallocation of lanes, a function normally undertaken either through the automatic function of the progression system or by the Fairness Committee placing crews into pre-allocated lanes in a chevron pattern. The system enables competing rowers to choose their racing lane and to be responsible for the choice they have made.

For the purposes of this experiment, the Athlete Lane Selection system will only be applied to the “International Events” in Belgrade for the repechage, semi-finals and final rounds (the lanes for the heats will be allocated by random draw as usual). A meeting to explain the procedure and answer any questions will be held for the team managers and the athletes competing in the international events in Belgrade on Thursday 31 May immediately after the Team Managers Meeting and Draw, which takes place at 15.00 hrs. The meeting will take place in the Team Managers meeting room.

6. Time Trial test at the Second World Rowing Cup regatta

The Council has decided that a test of time trials is needed for rowers and organisers in preparation for possible contingency scenarios at the Olympic regatta in 2020. The heats for all events at World Rowing Cup II in Linz-Ottensheim will be run as time trials, including the exhibition races for those events with less than 7 entries.

The time trials will be run over the full 2000m course from a fixed start. A detailed description of the procedure and circulation patterns will be published closer to the event. Please refer to “Bye-Law to Rule 70 – Time Trials” for details on time trials.

a. New pre-classification document submission system

Athletes seeking an international classification must first be pre-classified in order to determine eligibility and the sport class. Athletes that need to be pre-classified are required to submit FISA medical diagnostic forms and additional medical documents to FISA for evaluation. Previously this has been done via email, but from now on the documents must be directly uploaded to the new FISA Online Classification Portal. The Online Portal indicates the required documents that must be provided to be pre-classified for an impairment. Note that the Chief Classifier will only be notified to perform the pre-classification once all the required forms have been uploaded. The Portal also serves as a secure environment to store the athletes' medical data.

Access to the Portal is restricted to the FISA member federations. Instructions have been sent to the federations on how to use this new system. If these have not reached the federation yet, please contact FISA: databases@fisa.org

b. Classification Eligibility Guide

FISA has created a new online tool to help potential para athletes determine their eligibility for para rowing and to give an indication of what sport class they may be eligible for. The online tool is available here: [Classification Eligibility Guide](#)

2. National Federations and the Team Whereabouts Programme

This information can be submitted by fax or email using the attached forms.

We would like to draw your attention to Article 5.9.1 of the Anti-Doping Bye-Laws in the FISA Rule Book:

“5.9.1 Before 31 December of each year, each member National Federation must provide to FISA Headquarters quarterly training camp and main training location whereabouts for the following year. The completed Summary Training Camp form, Main Training Location form and if possible, the Individual Training Camp forms for its national teams, as well as any other information requested by FISA should be submitted to FISA Headquarters quarterly by 31 December, 31 March, 30 June and 30 September (These forms set out the dates and venues of the camps and main training locations). The individual training camp forms must be completed and received by FISA Headquarters no later than two weeks before the start of any above reported training camp. It is the responsibility of the national federation to update this information so that the information received by FISA is timely, accurate and complete at all times. Any changes to the list of training camps, or training camp contacts must be immediately communicated to FISA Headquarters.

Failure to submit complete timely quarterly whereabouts may result in sanctions being imposed on the national federation...”

3. Retirement Policy – Form Attached

Please note Articles 5.6.3 and 5.7.1 of the Anti-Doping Bye-Laws in the FISA Rule Book.

Retirement and Return to Competition

5.6.3 A Rower in FISA's Registered Testing Pool for that year shall continue to be subject to the obligation to comply with the whereabouts requirements of Annex 1 to the International Standard for Testing and Investigations until 31 December of that year, unless the Rower gives written notice to FISA that he has retired.

5.7.1 A Rower in the FISA Registered Testing Pool who has given notice of retirement to FISA may not resume competing at national and international rowing Competitions until he has given FISA written notice of his intent to resume competing and has made himself available for Testing for a period of at least six (6) months before returning to Competition, including (if requested) complying with the whereabouts requirements of Annex 1 to the International Standard for Testing and Investigations. WADA, in consultation with FISA and the Athlete's National Anti-Doping Organisation, may grant an exemption to the six-month written notice rule where the strict application of that rule would be manifestly unfair to an Athlete. This decision may be appealed under Article 13. Any competitive results obtained in violation of this Article 5.7.1 shall be Disqualified.

4. Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs)

To be submitted using ADAMS - international level rowers

Any international level rower using a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method for therapeutic reasons must have a valid FISA TUE. In addition to all rowers included in FISA's Registered Testing Pool, all Rowers who intend to compete in the following international competitions shall be considered international level for TUE purposes (reference paragraph 4.4.2 of the 2017 Anti-Doping Rules):

- World Rowing Championships for Senior, Under 23 and Junior
- Continental Rowing Championships, Regional Games and Olympic, Youth Olympic and Paralympic Qualification Regattas
- World Rowing Cup Regattas
- World and Continental Championships in rowing ergometer competitions
- Olympic, Youth Olympic and Paralympic Rowing Regattas

Rowers are advised that a FISA approved TUE may only be valid for national competitions 21 days after approval by FISA, therefore rowers are informed that they should apply for a TUE from their national anti-doping organisation as well as from FISA. Please refer to Article 4.4.2.2 of the FISA Anti-Doping Bye-Laws.

All TUEs submitted to FISA must be submitted in ADAMS. All relevant medical evidence must be attached. If an athlete does not have an account in ADAMS, please contact Natalie at FISA (natalie.schmutz@fisa.org) for an account to be set up.

Glucocorticosteroids

1. The use of glucocorticosteroids when administered by oral, intravenous, intramuscular or rectal routes is prohibited and requires a TUE.
2. Glucocorticosteroids administered by intraarticular, periarticular, peritendinous, epidural, intradermal and inhalation routes do not require a TUE or a declaration of use. However the athlete should declare the use of these substances on the doping control form if required to undergo an anti-doping test.

Asthma

3.

4. Inhaled formoterol, salbutamol and salmeterol are not included in the WADA Prohibited list. A declaration of use is not required however the use of these substances must be declared on the doping control form by the athlete if tested.
5. The inhalation of terbutaline still requires the submission of a TUE application in ADAMS.

5. 2018 FISA Registered Testing Pool

National Federations with rowers included in the FISA Registered Testing Pool will receive a separate communication with information on the FISA RTP for 2018. Please note that if a rower is included in the 2018 RTP it will be for one calendar year, that is until 31 December 2018.
