On the 21st of July of this year, Belgian National Day, the IOC OSC welcomed the Vrije Universiteit Brussel in the network of academic Olympic Studies and Research Centres.

This centre of the VUB, the Brussels Olympic Research and Education Centre, is an interdisciplinary centre which, in collaboration with the Belgian Olympic and Interfederal Committee (BOIC), will focus on research and education about the Olympic Movement and the Olympic Games as well as on the provision of continued professional development and multidisciplinary support services to coaches, athletes and experts in elite sport. This Olympic Centre will be part of a worldwide network established by the IOC OSC of over 50 university-based Olympic Studies and Research Centres, including the Olympic Chair Henri de Baillet Latour and Jacques Rogge in Management of Sport Organizations in Belgium, co-ordinated by the IOC Olympic Studies Centre.

INAUGURATION, ACADEMIC SESSION AND RECEPTION

On **Monday 14 November 2022** the Brussels Olympic Research and Education Centre will officially be inaugurated by **Professor Jan Danckaert**, rector of the Vrije Universiteit Brussel together joined by **Jean-Michel Saive**, president of the BOIC and **Professor Paul Wylleman**, chair of the Brussels Olympic Research and Education Centre.

This inauguration will be followed by the academic session **'Excellence in education and sport: Challenges, cross-over and collaboration'** with a panel of national and international experts and will end with a reception.

The inauguration, academic session and reception, which will be hosted in auditorium Ilya Prigogine, Nobel Prize winner for Chemistry, of the **Atomium in Brussels**, is open to, among others, athletes, coaches, technical directors and team managers, students, academics and dual career experts.
